Planting is completed. Additionally disease resistant Elm trees have been planted across the Town and the planned planting of Hornbeams trees at Eling Quayside have been temporarily postponed pending a meeting with AB Ports in relation to that area. In total 766 trees were introduced in the last planting season, via community planting supported by volunteer groups. Box tree moth issues are being addressed.</p>
